

# 2010 Participation Requirements

## The Great Refrigerator/Freezer Roundup \$50 Reward



The Great Refrigerator/Freezer Roundup and Recycling Program is brought to you by Minnesota Power. It is designed to reward you for saving energy and to encourage you to properly dispose of your second refrigerator or freezer or to encourage you to dispose of your primary refrigerator when you purchase a new energy efficient model. When you work with us to dispose of that old, energy inefficient refrigerator or freezer, we will reward you with \$50 for the first rounded up unit and \$35 for a second unit, if applicable. Getting rid of that old refrigerator or freezer in the basement or garage saves energy, typically several hundred dollars over its lifetime. By recycling this appliance, you ensure that it doesn't end up in a landfill, negatively impact our atmosphere, or end up as an energy hog in another home. ### Program Participation Requirements

1. You must be a Minnesota Power (MP) residential, retail customer (receive your electric bill from Minnesota Power).
2. You must own the refrigerator or freezer and it must be picked up at a location listed on the billing account.
3. An adult must be at home for the scheduled pickup of the refrigerator and/or freezer.
4. Product:
  - ✓ The refrigerator must be at least 10 cubic feet to a maximum of 27 cubic feet. Larger models will be treated on a case-by-case basis.
  - ✓ Freezers must be a residential-sized unit.
  - ✓ The refrigerator and/or freezer rounded up must be in working condition (i.e., it must be plugged in and working when the contractor picks it up for recycling). Remember, when you purchase a new refrigerator it is the perfect time to recycle your old one and get rewarded for it.
  - ✓ You can round up a maximum of two qualifying appliances per year, per dwelling.

### Process to Collect your Reward

1. Call 1-866-552-6755 or visit [www.mnpower.com/refrigeratorrecycling](http://www.mnpower.com/refrigeratorrecycling) to schedule a refrigerator and/or freezer pickup. You will be asked to verify that you are an MP customer based on the residential address listed on the billing account. Please make sure the unit is plugged in and working when the contractor arrives. **The contractor will not pick up non-working units.**
2. After scheduling your pickup on the phone or online, you will be contacted the day before the pickup to verify the date, time, and location and to confirm you will be available.

3. A licensed and insured Minnesota Power contractor will come to your home to round up the unit. Their personnel will be wearing identification badges designating them as an MP contractor. The contractor will be responsible for inspecting your appliance to ensure it meets the above requirements. They will also disable the appliance (cut the cord) to guarantee it will not be used again. The contractor is responsible for any damage incurred in taking the appliance out of your home.
4. The unit will be loaded onto the truck and taken to a certified recycling facility to be properly processed and recycled according to the EPA's Responsible Appliance Disposal (RAD) program guidelines. This includes recovery of ozone-depleting chemicals from old refrigerators and freezers and ensures the following:
  - Refrigerant is recovered and reclaimed or destroyed.
  - Polyurethane insulating foam is recovered and destroyed, or the blowing agent is recovered and reclaimed.
  - Metals, plastics, and glass are recycled.
  - PCBs, mercury, and used oil are recovered and properly disposed of.
5. Within 4–6 weeks of the pickup, you can expect your reward check—\$50 for the first unit and \$35 for the second unit, if applicable. This offer is proposed to last until December 31, 2010 but can be changed at any time subject to dollars available and modifications to program requirements.
